Coming Soon: The John Miracles for Lent



Here's a bit of Bible trivia for you—what are the "seven signs" of Jesus in John's gospel?

Matthew, Mark, and Luke have miracles and parables, but John, always quirky and different, has his famous seven signs.

They are:

- 1. Changing Water Into Wine (John 2:1-11)
- 2. Healing the Royal Official's Son (John 4:46-54)
- 3. Healing the paralytic at the pool (John 5:1-18)
- 4. Feeding over 5,000 with fish and loaves (John 6:1-14)
- 5. Walking on the water (John 6:15-25)
- 6. Healing a man born blind (John 9:1-41)
- 7. Raising Lazarus from the dead (John 11:1-46)

In John 1, the writer promises us that through Jesus will experience *grace upon grace*, and these stories exemplify what he means. It's not just water into wine – it's the best wine! It's not just restoring a man's vision—it's restoring him to his family and community.


Besides these signs, we will also encounter again this Lent other John wonders—Nicodemus' nighttime anxieties leading to John 3:16, and the widowed/divorced woman at the well in John 4.

All the gospels have their own flavor, but I'm partial to Luke and John. I hope you will join us as we go deep on John coming up in Lent.

Feb 5 5th Sun after Epiphany Isaiah 58:1-12, Ps 112:1-10, 1 Cor. 2:1-16, Matt 5:13-20 Jesus, the light of the world, calls his followers to let the light of their good works shine before others. Through baptism we are sent into the world to shine with light of Christ.

Feb 12 6th Sun after Epiphany Deut. 30:15-20, Ps 119:1-8, 1 Cor 3:1-9, Matt 5:21-37 Jesus instructions to the crowd reveal a pattern of behavior that honors both God and neighbor. We too are invited to embrace these commandments not out of fear of retribution, but because God has promised that to do so means life for us.

Feb 19 Transfiguration of Our Lord Exodus 24:12-18, Ps 2, 2 Peter 1:16-21, Matt 17:1-9 On a high mountain Jesus is revealed as God's beloved Son, echoing the words at his baptism. This vision of Glory sustains us as Jesus faces his impending death in Jerusalem.
