What does being a Lutheran mean to you?

Our awesome God has given me the gift of faith. I believe I am saved by His grace and love through Jesus' death on the cross. I am forgiven and have the promise of eternal life.

Do you have a favorite bible story? If yes, what makes it your favorite?

I like hearing the Christmas and Easter stories, many of the Psalms, and Romans 8:31-39. Through hearing the stories over and over, I believe nothing can separate me from the love of God. Hymns, sermons, devotions, and books of faith I have read bring this truth home to me.

How has your faith changed throughout your life?

I was baptized in the Catholic Church but was raised by my grandmother who was a Lutheran. When I was little, there was a struggle between my two families as to what church I would end up in. I went to St. Paul's in Brenham for Sunday School and was confirmed there which greatly influenced my life. When Winston and I got married and Karen was born, our faith grew with the help of several pastors at Zion, Brenham. For the past 18 years our faith has been nurtured at Christ Lutheran, Brenham. Working in church offices for about 27 years total, my faith grew

Pastor's Column

For All the Saints

A few years ago, Pixar released a new film called *Coco*. It was set in Mexico, and incorporated the ‘Día de los Muertos’ (or, Day of the Dead) tradition that occurs each year at Halloween and All Saints Day. The focus of Día de los Muertos is to remember family members who have died by building an “ofrenda” or altar of sorts with a photo of every deceased family member on it. Families will also decorate these ofrendas with the favorite foods of the deceased, and they spend the night retelling stories of loved ones, choosing to intentionally remember and grieving together. The film *Coco* follows a grandson learning new truths about his grandfather through this tradition.

We don’t typically build ofrendas as a Christian practice in the United States, but we do celebrate All Saints Day as a way of intentionally remembering our loved ones. Some churches light a candle for every saint lost from the past year. Some ring a bell for each saint’s name. Some churches do indeed decorate the sanctuary with photos brought from members. To someone outside the Christian faith, All Saints Day is perhaps one of the strangest festivals of the church year. In general, we don’t like to talk about death in our culture. We ignore it, avoid it, disregard it. But the Christian world pauses – at least once a year – to dwell on it, and to hear again the promise that one day we will be saints, too, and reunited with those we remember and love.

A few weeks before I accepted the call to serve here, my maternal grandfather died after a few months in hospice. It was the first family funeral I had attended, and my first real experience of burying someone I knew well and loved well. I remember feeling – especially in the immediate months after he died – a strong desire to talk about him to anyone I encountered. I wanted people to ask about him, because I wanted to remember. But as we all know, once the funeral has happened, often we forget to check in on those grieving, or we simply ignore it, not wanting to “stir the pot” of farewell emotions.

I’m glad we celebrate All Saints, because it gives us permission to talk about those we yearn to remember. We talk about the ways our friends and family made us laugh, the memorable habits and traits of a person, and perhaps most importantly, the ways they influenced our lives. And when we do this remembering, I believe the kingdom of heaven and our lives here on this earth grow a little closer together.

7. To complete the sign-up process, you will need to verify your email address by clicking on the link sent to you in that email.
8. Once you confirm your email, you may open the app and click Sign In to log into your church's directory using your email and new password.

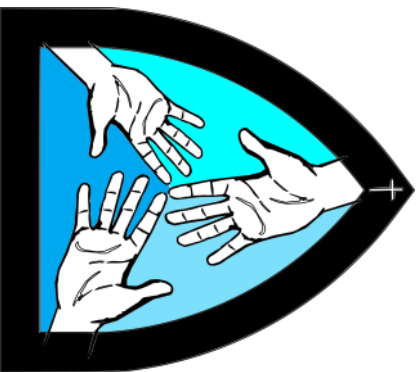
