

Pastor's Column

Women leading the way, from womb to tomb



How bizarre it truly is that for centuries and centuries, only men were allowed to preach and lead churches.

The irony is especially on display during the two peak holidays of the church year, Christmas and Easter. The angel Gabriel shows up to talk to a young woman—not her dad or brothers, but right to her. Jesus is carried for 9 months inside the body of a woman. Because Joseph was much older than Mary, he was likely raised in adolescence by just a woman.

On the third day, it is again women who show up at the tomb. My pastor growing up jokingly called them the "Spice Girls" because of what they are carrying. Women are the first to know the news of resurrection—the news that changed everything on a micro and macro scale. It changes how to think about our own death, and of course it changed the course of global history.

It didn't start this way of course. Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Phoebe, Dorcas, Lydia, and many others all have early leadership in the church. But as the church grew, it more and more started to follow the patriarchal culture of the age rather than being a distinct community following Jesus.

I write this of course a week before Christmas, yet it will be read on the other side of the holiday by all of you. I put it out there (as I have before) with a plea to honor the women in your life who taught you faith and who modeled faith. And for all the women who have faced gender injustice or suffer from the gender wage gap or who have been told church leadership just "isn't for you," I am truly sorry. In 2023, we again have 2 female congregational presidents, and that makes me happy!
