Pastor's Column

How Church Membership is Changing



Some decades ago, an "active" church member was defined as an individual or family that attended 3+ Sundays per month. Some folks in older generations can remember this time, when so-called Blue Laws were still in effect (shutting down almost all businesses on Sundays), when youth sports and activities avoided Wednesday nights and full weekend tournaments, and when churches were both the spiritual **and** social hub of any small or medium sized community.

The world of course has gone through tidal waves of changes in recent decades. Public schools have become the center of most small town life, youth athletics and activities have become year-round, the world is busier and more connected. "Televangelists" became a new term, as church became available on tvs and smart phone screens. For many families now, both parents need to work, and Sunday can be the only day in a multi-week stretch where they get to actually *rest*. These days, the general church consensus is that an "active" church individual or family attends once per month.

Many pastors (including me) are curious to see how COVID might shift this even more. For now though, my vision for what it means to be a church member is less about measuring attendance, and more about encouraging engagement. My dream and hope is that everyone connected to our shared ministry can find their own "sweet spot" of serving or engaging with this place. That sweet spot looks different for everyone because God equips us with varying passions, gifts, skills, etc.

As naïve as this may sound, I do believe that a team-based approach to ministry a) is highly effective, and b) leads to more joy / less volunteer burn out. Every organization, including churches, struggles with the 80/20 problem (20% of the people do 80% of the work). I think Jesus aimed to design Christian communities to be full of engaged servant leaders, where everyone has a seat at the table and investment in the community.

Here's to you finding your sweet spot!
