Pastor's Column

A 2020 Reading Challenge!

A friend of mine shared with me in January that he had made a goal for 2019 to read 30 minutes a day. His plan was to continue in 2020. And then he offered this warning: “It sounds easy, but you’d be amazed how tempting it is to get other things done on the checklist rather than stopping everything to read.” He then shared a list of the 20+ books he read during the year—“You’ve gotta read this one! And this one!”

For the Christian who loves to read, there is no shortage of books out there to encounter. Of course, many of us faithfully read our bibles, exploring forgotten books or stories. Many of us read fiction stories that might inspire the imagination of our faith. Non-fiction memoirs and histories can teach incredible things about the changes in organized religion and church over time, too.

I love to read—always have, really. We weren’t allowed to have video games in our family growing up, so we read a lot. But even for me, a lover of books and new information, when I heard this stranger share the challenge of reading 30 minutes every day, I thought, “Wow – I really haven’t been reading that consistently.” So as I work on my own reading and develop my list of books for the year, I wanted to share with you all some of my favorite faith-oriented books that I’ve read before. It’s a short starter list, but hopefully one or two will grab your attention and encourage a little reading:

1. *Take this Bread* by Sara Miles. This is my all-time favorite book written by a person of faith. She tells the story of going from atheism to starting a food pantry at her local church. Fair warning, though – Sara was a war reporter, and her language is often colorful.
2. *What We Talk About When We Talk About God* by Rob Bell. For those who don’t know him, Bell is known for powerful, short books – this one focuses on how we imagine God in our prayer and daily life.
3. *Mountains Beyond Mountains* by Tracy Kidder. The story of Dr. Paul Farmer, a champion of global health, who understands better than almost anyone that to be great means to be a servant.
4. *The Lemon Tree* by Sandy Tolan. If you are interested in a new perspective on Israel/Palestine conflict, this is an amazing book.
5. *The Strength to Love* – a collection of sermons written and preached by Martin Luther King Jr

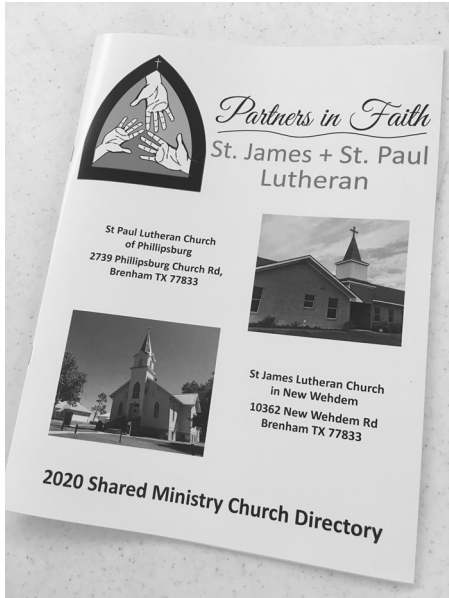

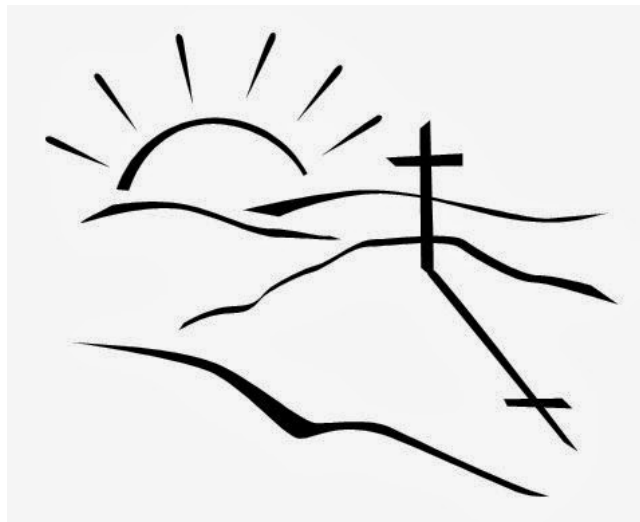

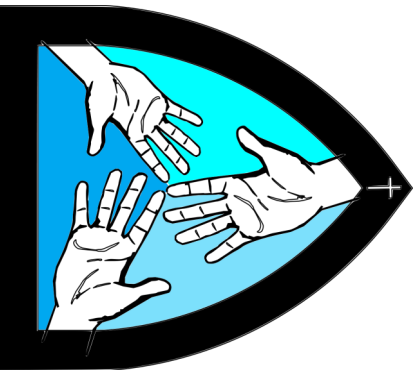
