SUNDAY MORNING WORSHIP: GOODBYE ZOOM, HELLO PARKING LOTS

Instructions and Information for our June Outdoor Services

1. Starting June 7, we will have joint "parking lot" services. We are going to revisit our plan for Easter Sunday and use a short range FM transmitter. So—drive to church, park your car, and tune in via the radio! We will post signs showing what station to tune to.

2. Services will start at 9am. The time is earlier because of heat. Services will be 25-30 minutes. Depending on turnout, we may do multiple services, so this time could change.

3. We will have communion— "BYOC" style! Please bring your own bread and grape juice (I'd rather not encourage 100 people to drive home with an open container in the car). We'll also pass out familiar hymn booklets for people to keep and re-use.

4. To cut down on location confusion, the plan is to meet at St James for all of June, and at St Paul for all of July. Does this mean we won't be inside the building until August? No. It's just the plan for now.

5. We are hoping to transition to an outdoor picnic style worship by June 21. People can still come and stay in their cars and listen to the service on the radio, or you can also bring a few lawn chairs, or a blanket, and pick a spot in the shaded area between the St James church, playground, and office. *We strongly encourage everyone outside to wear a mask out of love for your neighbor*, and we will need to keep distance between families. Because the virus spreads much more from aerosols than any other source, meeting outside really cuts down on the probability of unknowingly sharing the virus. If June 7 goes smoothly, we might even try this on June 14.

6. A reminder: the church is the people, not the building. Jesus is with us wherever we gather. Worship will be different, but a step closer to what is familiar.6a. Could this entire plan change? Absolutely. Covid-19 forces us to be adaptable.

**A note from Pastor Evan: I understand that many people simply aren't comfortable exposing themselves or risking exposure to family / patients / etc. *No one is going to hold guilt or judgment based on attendance.* The 1pm KWHI radio service is staying so that there is an option for everyone. You are free to make your own choices.

You may have seen me walking around downtown shopping, worshiping a few seats away from you at church, or leading music for VBS. I have also had the incredible privilege to be cast at Unity a number of times (The Syringa Tree, Amelia, Daddy Long Legs, The Fantasticks, The Philadelphia Story, You Never Can Tell, Little Women, etc..). I have also found my second family in Brenham. So I felt it was fitting and appropriate that in this important moment in my life for me to turn to you, my home.

I am an actress and I love my job, but I felt it was time that I further myself in my knowledge and skills. Honestly, I truly felt God pulling me to my next chapter. I was led in many specific ways to The Royal Conservatoire of Scotland. This is one of those times you look at God and say, "Wow, really? You want my heart to be hopeful for something so impossible?" Let me explain why this seemed impossible. First, they look at applications from all over the world and accept only eleven actors. It's a giant leap for an actress who lives paycheck to paycheck to move all the way to Scotland.

Throughout my time applying, auditioning and praying, God really worked on my heart. He taught me to lean on Him and wait on His timing. Then one morning I woke up and had been accepted! Praise God!

But my leaning is not done. I need to pay for tuition quite soon. With COVID-19, my jobs were canceled. Live theatre was halted. I searched options, prayed diligently, and God led me to look for patrons who loved me and would want to support me. My need is this: \$35,000 by the end of June. I cannot comprehend this, but then again, I never comprehended getting into this school in the first place.

June KWHI Services Will Continue

We will continue our Sunday 1p—1:30pm worship on KWHI, both AM (1280) and FM (101.7). We will continue this for all June Sundays. It is also available on the KWHI app and online—<u>https://kwhi.com/</u>

These services include: opening liturgy, readings, a sermon, some music selections, closing prayers / creed / blessing.

For many members, this is the easiest way to access church. It has also been a great resource for many non-members looking for spiritual nourishment during these hard days.

The cost for 30 minutes of radio time is only \$100, split between both churches. Our councils consider it money well spent to reach those who are not able to worship with us in other ways

Financial Notes in the time of COVID

The councils and staff of St Paul and St James say thank you for such steadfast generosity in the past few months. We know that for many families, financial security feels more vulnerable than ever. For others, perhaps your own household has been relatively unaffected, but you likely have family or good friends who have faced sudden job loss or pay reductions. In the midst of all this, thank you for every good gift shared with our churches.

We have been amazed by the steady and faithful stewardship. A few updates to share:

St. Paul: Our April income was \$9,775.17, and expenses were \$5,397.94. Our working balance is \$25,512. We have been very blessed by regular giving, and additional generous giving in recent months.

St. James: From January through April, we budgeted for an expected income of \$49,120 in envelope giving, and we have received \$43,225 with no in person worship since mid-March. Our working balance is \$97,466.

St James also applied and received funds for the **Payroll Protection Program** for two months of coverage for Pastor Evan's base salary. The application came from St. James because payroll is through St. James, but St. Paul also benefits by having a lower reimbursement total for pastor's compensation.

ST JAMES NEW WEHDEM UPDATES

BIG NEWS! We've started direct deposit giving.

In March, our church council decided to begin direct deposit giving as an option. We started with a "guinea pig" group (mostly church council members) to make sure all the details were correct. It's been a complete success so far, and we are ready to expand this and make it available to all members.

Essentially: members can choose to give any amount on the 1st of the month, or the 15th of the month, or both, and that amount will be automatically withdrawn from your bank account. **Of course, traditional envelope giving is still a-okay and welcome.** This is just a new additional option.
