Pastor's Column

I want to walk as a child of the light...



"Sometimes it's easy to forget that we spend most of our time stumbling around the dark. Then, suddenly, sometimes, a light gets turned on."

This is a quote from the film Spotlight, the Best-Picture-winning film from a few years back about the Boston Globe journalists who were the first to uncover hidden abuse and misconduct within Catholic clergy. If you like a good riveting drama, it's a must see.

For today, I've been pondering that quote after spending Wednesday, October 20, talking with our Bible study group on the gospel of John. Specifically, John loves to play with themes of light and darkness from start to finish in his Gospel. Light is generally a synonym for life for John, and likewise, darkness a synonym for death. Some examples:

John 1 - What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.

John 12:35 - You are going to have the light just a little while longer. Walk while you have the light, before darkness over takes you. Whoever walks in the dark does not know where they are going.

John 3:19 - Light has come into the world, but people loved darkness instead of light because their deeds were evil.

John 9:4-5 – We must do the works of him who sent me while it is day; night is coming when no one can work. As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world.

John seems to beg us to ponder – are we living in the day, in the light, in the life that God dreams for us? Are we enlightening others with the good news of Jesus, reflecting back light from the one who first loved us? Are we loving ourselves as we should? Loving others as we should? John loves love too – using the world more than 50 times in his work. Or are we stuck in the dark – turning away from our neighbors, seeing the worst of each other, judging others for thinking differently, trapping ourselves in echo chambers of people who only look and think like us? In the dark, it's easy to point fingers and blame, and it's really hard to be creative at problem solving.

Only you can know for yourself what it means to consider living with an attitude toward light and life rather than darkness and death.
