Pastor's Column

What to do when there's no road map

A few years ago, I was gifted a book called *Canoeing the Mountains* that tells the story of Meriwether Lewis and his exploratory adventure to find a water route connecting the Pacific Ocean to the Mississippi River. The book focuses on this question: what do you do when the world in front of you is nothing like the world behind you?

This was the question facing Lewis after months and months of going upstream in the Missouri River, tracking their way backwards through the plains, the Dakotas, Montana.....and they finally found the source of the river, thinking their hard work was over. And then, they climbed a small hill, and discovered a massive, stunning obstacle to the west: the Rocky Mountains. Their canoes weren't going to get the job done anymore. Their future was remarkably different from their entire familiar past.

Lately, I'm guessing many of us have felt like Meriwether Lewis, staring at those mountains. I've found myself on a few occasions saying, "Okay God.....I know you're with me.....but I feel really unsettled by so many changes at once.....and I'm concerned for the health of so many....and I'm just not exactly sure what to do with this very different future."

No one can predict the future—but it certainly felt easier to do so three months ago than right now. Our biological clocks are off.....our calendars are wiped clean....and we have no idea when it will actually be safe to make "plans" again......the whole concept of time is different.

And yet, so says our God, "You were born for such a time as this." Those words are spoken to Esther when she faces a future that is incredibly different from her entire life up to that point. Overnight, she has a massive increase in terms of her leadership power and responsibility to protect those around her. Just like her, many of us have felt incredible surges of responsibility and safekeeping this past month. And I believe that God looks at each of us in this moment in time and says the same thing as was spoken to her: you were born for such a time as this.

Nothing makes us adapt quite like forced change. The last six weeks have been an intense pace of adapting. And let's be honest: it's hard. So I've been trying to place God's promise to Esther as a physical visual in front of me wherever I can—on my desk at work, on my car dashboard, on a mirror at home. You were born for such a time as this. The mountains ahead look burdensome. But God will not abandon us...so we walk onward, one step at a time.

Easter Sunday

During our Easter Zoom Worship, we were asked about a favorite Easter tradition. While the traditions differed, building an Easter nest was a fond memory. With the strong German heritage in our area, I was curious as to the origin of an Easter nest and this is what I found (source:germangirlinamerica.com).

Where does the Easter Nest Tradition Come From?

The Easter nests come from the story of the **Easter Bunny's origins**. Hundreds of years ago, **Duchess Rosilinda von Lindenberg** went into hiding with her children and servants in a remote village. For saving her life, she thanked the people who protected her by bringing them chickens who laid eggs. She wanted to make it extra special for the children, so she had them build little nests. Secretly she colored some of the eggs and hid them in the nests. When the kids discovered the colored eggs, they were excited... and a little confused when a rabbit bounded out of the bushes. The kids presumed the BUNNY had brought the eggs.

And the story stuck, and eventually, traveled all the way to Texas with early German settlers. So, many of the stories include going the Saturday before Easter to pick wildflowers including bluebonnets, buttercups, Indian paintbrush, and Mexican hat. We would take them home and decorate "nests" in our Easter baskets inside the front door of our home. In the morning the nests would be filled with candy."
