I'm writing this at the end of a July that was a really rich 'month plus' of ministry. We baptized two new saints and said goodbye to a saint at New Wehdem, sparked faith in 60+ kiddos during shared VBS, hiked the hills with confirmands at Chrysalis. We had our shared country western service and fun big Father's Day worships.

Traditionally, the summer time in congregations is a bit slower, but we've been thriving these past weeks. For the first time at both churches since March 2020, we have returned consistently to our pre-covid worship numbers.

I hope you've felt the fulfillment I have from our ministry lately. It's not just the attendance lift (though it helps). It's not just the big program weeks (though they help, too). Even though the heat makes us all feel lethargic, I've felt an energy lift the last couple months in my own spiritual life. God is at work, clearly, in all of us.

Her point: God is always pulling us into an expansive future, rich in opportunity. Right now, as we approach 5 years together as shared ministry partners, our future is bright here.
