FILLED BOXES DUE NOVEMBER 8

- 1. Get a standard-size shoebox to pack for a child.
- 2. Select a quality "wow" toy such as a doll, soccer ball with pump or stuffed animal to bless a child.
- 3. Pack full with other fun toys, hygiene items, and school supplies.
 - 4. Pray for the child who will receive your gift. Include a personal note and photo if you wish.
- 5. Include a \$9 check to cover shipping and other project costs.
- 6. Leave your completed shoebox at the back of either church! We have brochures at both congregations if you have questions.

SUNDAY MORNING WORSHIP: IMPORTANT UPDATES

Instructions and Information for our November Services

- *A volunteer will be outside the church doors / FLC doors to check your forehead temperature as you arrive each Sunday.
- *Wear your mask as you enter and leave worship. We prefer that you wear it throughout the service if possible. We have extra masks if needed.
- *Sanitize your hands as you enter the sanctuary (sanitizer provided)
- *Pick up your bulletin and communion kit as you enter. You do not need to bring your own communion if you are worshipping in the sanctuary or FLC.
- *Leave your offering on your way in or way out.
- *Share the Peace with a wave or peace sign!
- *You may sit with family or others that you are seeing regularly. Otherwise, space yourselves from others. Pews are marked so you will be 6-10 feet apart.
- *Remember that the short range radio broadcast will still be happening at each church, if you prefer to stay in your car. Bulletins will be outside for you.
- *At St James Last name A-L will be in the sanctuary, and M-Z will be in the FLC and will change every two weeks. Signs outside the sanctuary and FLC indicate seatings. If your family is divided up (for example, Dannhaus & Thayne), you can choose to be together in one place. We will rotate back and forth every two weeks. The service is being videoed into the Family Life Center. If you are not feeling well, please stay in your car.
- *At St. Paul everyone can be inside the sanctuary or outside.
- *We are continuing our services on KWHI 1280AM and 101.7FM at 4:30pm. Services can also be streamed live on the KWHI app and online—https://kwhi.com/. Also note that sermons are available for a couple months on our website: www.sjsplutheran.org/sermons.

Pastor's Column

A Paradox Faith

For a new convert to Christianity, faith can be a little confusing.

We're sinners and saints? We're lost and we're found? We're broken and holy?

In fact, Luther wrote at the Reformation's outset that "A Christian is a perfectly free lord of all, subject to none. A Christian is also a perfectly dutiful servant of all, subject to all." Say what, Martin?

The paradoxes of faith pile up quickly:

- Consider the backwards beatitudes, where the meek inherit the earth, the poor are given the kingdom of God, the mourning are comforted, and the hungry are filled. We hear these this month at All Saints.
- Consider the shocking behavior of Jesus on the cross, where any image of God as vengeful is confounded by this pierced savior forgiving those who are killing him *and* offering mercy to an actual criminal by his side.
- Consider that the American way leans toward private, "I can take of myself" independence, while the church proclaims that grace and love and forgiveness and mercy are most fully comprehended in community.
- Consider the "paradox of the incarnation" the invisible, all-powerful God comes to us as vulnerable flesh and bone, hungry and sweating.

We are paradox people. And I love it.

I spend most days amazed at the fact that the Christian church has been chewing on the same parables and narratives for 2000 years, and they still ignite our engagement and curiosity and wonder. For me, it comes from the paradoxes woven into tales like the prodigal son, or the choice of mistake-riddled Peter as the rock of the infant church, or the paradoxical "good news" of the cross.

Our own Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton notes that God calls the ELCA to be a "both and" church in an "either or" world. This is the gift of being paradox people. We are able to hold in tension the struggles of the everyday with the often surprising and wonder-inducing work of God in the world.

Paradox people understand that all humans are just like Peter—nearly sanctified and nearly putting our foot in our mouth with every other sentence. Just like *Petros* we are given a vocation by God, even though we are full of faults. But by leaning into the paradoxes of God, we listen and ask more questions rather than assuming we know everything there is to know. We are drawn into the mysteries of God.

One final paradox, from Matthew 10 (the message translation) "If your first concern is to look after yourself, you'll never find yourself. But if you forget about yourself and look to me, you'll find both yourself and me."

As Jesus teaches, abundant life and faith are found in the tension of paradox.
