Pastor's Column

Updates and reflections as I sit in an empty sanctuary....

On Monday March 16, the St James council met at a small table in our quiet Family Life Center. We processed together the wild news of the day—a CDC recommendation to have no gatherings larger than 50, a federal recommendation to have no gatherings larger than 10. I looked around the table. “Good,” I thought, “there’s only 8 of us.”

We said the Lord’s Prayer—without holding hands like normal—turned off the lights, locked the doors, and drove home.

I usually really love being the last one out at St Paul or St James at nighttime. It’s so peaceful. Such amazing views of stars and moon. Maybe an occasional cow sound in the background. Christmas Eve night is the most magical of all—*this was the kind of peaceful night when the angels suddenly peppered the sky with light and song!* But on March 16, it was somber. We initially said “no church until at least April 1,” but I knew it could be months. Like all of us, I miss our church family.

And yet, since then, like all mammals, we adapt. I have been overjoyed to see the lively participation in Zoom. It’s totally new for so many of us, and yet so many have been willing to experiment and give it a shot even if it’s far outside their comfort zone. My heart has been filled by the many moments when I’ve called someone in our church family to check in, and they share that their neighbors or children or church friends have already called.

So as we wait with a holy and certain hope, “a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul” (Hebrews 6:19), here is a musing from my devotional journal:

We can run out of masks.

We can run out of paper products.

We can run out of things to do at home.

We can run out of ventilators.

We can run out of food in our freezer stash.

We can run out of energy from 24/7 childcare.

We can run out of shows and movies to watch and books to read.

We can run out of Purell.

We can run out of money.

But we will *never* run out of God’s grace.

And therefore, there is no excuse to run out of kindness.

How has your faith changed throughout your life?

My faith has mirrored the life stages that I have gone through as I aged. When I was a teenager, I thought I knew all I needed to know and didn't give much thought to my faith. In my 20's, I thought I had to do things alone, make my mark on the world. My faith-walk reflected that lack of maturity. As I entered my thirties, I realized how little I knew of our Savior and his Word. So, I immersed myself in the bible and got a head-full of knowledge that was not always tempered in wisdom. As I entered my forties life seemed to force a balance in my faith walk. I began to understand the balance between knowing God's Word and gracefully applying it to myself and encouraging others to do the same.

If you could ask God a question, what would it be, and why? I would ask God: what happens when we die? I know we are transported to His presence and that we spend eternity with Him. However, there are varying degrees of fear for most around death and what that entails. Death is the great unknown for every person on this planet and it would ease much anxiety if we had a better understanding of it.

I know that you've experienced different styles of worship and different denominations. Do you have a favorite memory from a non-Lutheran setting?

I attended a Catholic Funeral Mass several years back. I watched as the priest waived the incense over the deceased. I then experienced the holy water being sprinkled on the deceased and upon those attending the funeral. Many of the traditions and ceremonies I had learned in the past came alive. I had studied why they were performed and what they meant. I began to cry. Not because of the sadness of the funeral, but out of joy, because I understood why these things were being done and how they brought honor and glory to God. Sometimes I wish we would explain why we as Lutherans worship as we do. I believe it would help the service come alive even more than it does now.

What similarities do you see between all Christian churches?

All Christian Churches seem to agree on a couple of things. Jesus Christ is the Son of God and the second person of the Trinity. God exist as one God but in three godheads. (Father-Son-Holy Spirit) This core belief unites us as Christians; however, it is everything else that seems to divide the church and keeps it from becoming the church (bride) that Christ is coming back to claim. My prayer is that we grow to understand that there is more that unites us than divides us as Christians.

Do you have a favorite bible story or parable? If yes, what makes it your favorite?

My favorite bible verse is Jeremiah 1: 5a. "Before I formed you in the womb, I knew you" While God is talking to Jeremiah, I believe He is also talking to us; to every human being. God's love is so vast that He literally knows every person from before they were born. It shows us a God who loves us all and wants to be intimately involved in every aspect of our lives. We serve a big big God who has love for all his children and yearns to be part of our everyday life.

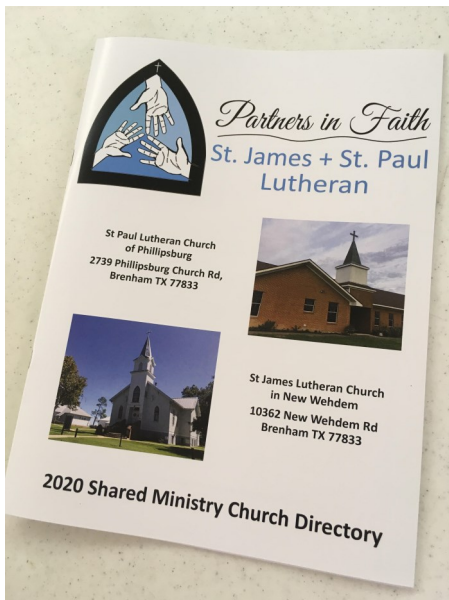
Shared Ministry Updates!

We have received the following information from Lutheran World Relief (LWR): Lutheran World Relief values the health and safety of our community members, donors and volunteers. Until we know more about the Coronavirus or COVID-19, we have made the decision to postpone the collection of Quilts & Kits of Care for April 2020 & May 2020.

These are unprecedented times. LWR made the decision to postpone collections for the following reasons:

1. We care about the health & safety of our community members
2. We want to abide by the guidelines of the CDC (Centers for Disease Control) and elected officials to limit gatherings to no more than (10) people.
3. Churches are closed, so many quilters & kit makers can't meet to facilitate an Ingathering.
4. Colleges are closed, so some of the labor for Ingatherings is not available.
5. again...We care about the health & safety of our community members!!

Texas LWR Ingatherings in Seguin, Dallas and Houston will be rescheduled for November 2020 (exact dates TBD after churches and college return to work).

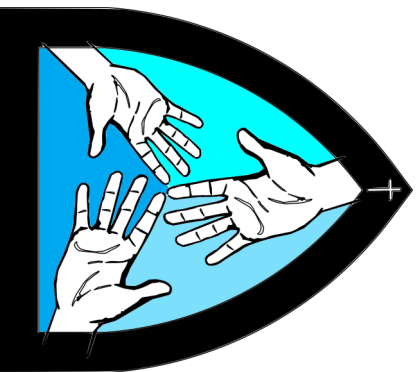
