One of the key duties of any pastor is to care for the flock, and in recent months, I've witnessed the continued presence of grief in our lives. It can look like many things—sadness, fear, denial, bargaining, anger, shock, fatigue.

We can grieve our children getting older, we can grieve canceled travel/experiences, we can grieve the end of a job, we can grieve the loss of people...the list is limitless.

This fall, I'd like to start a simple grief sharing group. The plan is simple: I'll put a pot of coffee on, we'll sit in a circle, we'll share together about loved ones and losses, and along the way I'll aim to provide some structure and resources.

This might sound really scary to some people. I get that. Many of us would rather eat a plate of our least favorite vegetable than be vulnerable. But it is such important work to do.

*This is not meant, by the way, only for those dealing with fresh grief.* Everyone's timeline is different.

# Pastor's Column

### Give Us Green Hands



The mission statement of my college included this line: "Reflecting its Lutheran heritage, Wittenberg challenges students to become responsible global citizens."

The words always struck me as a little bit odd—wouldn't they follow "reflecting its Lutheran heritage" with something explicitly about Jesus, or a comment that we are saved by grace, or a claim that we are both sinners and saints, or a joke that the campus dining hall experience was similar to a church fellowship potluck?

Wittenberg chose none of those options. Instead, they stated first and foremost that seeing life through a lens of faith gave eyes to see with a *global* perspective.

I've spent much of the past few weeks thinking about this globe we inhabit—not necessarily because of Wittenberg's mission statement, but because creation is groaning and gasping under the weight of greenhouse gases. A few weeks ago, a United Nations report was released, stating that we are essentially now locked in to global temperatures rising within the next two decades, calling it a "code red for humanity."

We care for the earth because it is one of the fundamental ways of expressing love for God and love for neighboring people and creatures.

We care for the earth because so many mountaintop experiences of faith for Christians occur while being away at outdoor ministry settings; camps and retreat centers do amazing work in forming faith—just ask any kid returning from a week at Lutherhill this summer.

We care for the earth because we follow Jesus, and Jesus had a global-sized vision for God's kingdom of abundant life for all.

Climate change is really the classic example of a problem that feels so big that we say, "Well, my daily choices can't make a dent" in terms of helping the solution.

Often right now, it might feel like any one of us can see three or four different

"problem fires" that need to be put out, and yet it seems our bucket is empty.

So sometimes, I pray something like this, and it does help: "God please just show me what is mine to do, because otherwise I will feel horrible for not doing everything, or just numb for not doing a single thing. Give me grace for myself and others. Help me to trust that you will give me what I need to give away. And Lord, please show us and this earth some mercy."

After all, there is no planet B.
